1. Greg Crisafulli-If there is no affordable housing, the rents will increase. If the owner of a home were in the hospital for a period of time he could be evicted.
2. Angelo Crisafulli-There are a lot of unintended consequences. There will be consequences to those who are grandfathered in. Once this takes place it will never be removed and the homes will have no value. It was stated this was to prevent another Casitas Del Rio. If there was a problem, why didn't someone come to me about it. We have tried to stay on top of it. There are people living there on fixed incomes and they need to have affordable housing.
3. Penina Weaver-I have a problem with the terminology of the ordinance. This focuses on the lower income residents of Glendive. This will stifle growth. We need to control to a degree the crime and danger that may come in these types of areas. I have some houses that are in worse condition than some of the mobile homes. I am married to a county worker and you may have a county worker who is not able to stay in the county because we can't afford to live here. This needs to be thought through, especially in the wording that is nit-picky.
4. Jeff Barnes-You're gonna push work away from Glendive. In MT we have a high rate of unemployment, you're gonna have a lot of unemployment. I don't know why you want to push the revenue out of Glendive. It doesn't make sense. People aren't rich. Locals will not be able to stay in their own homes.
5. Mark Hickman-The people policing it should be by law going in to check these places-It should not be up to the owner to police this. I don't want anyone without a search warrant to be able to come in.
6. Alan Beeber-The inspection portion of the ordinance (D2) without prior notice (F2) in a timely manner work on. Who determines the timely manner? Most people work on improvements as they can afford to. It is not the American thing to do, not the Montanan thing to do.
7. Kathy Green-I have not stake in this, but it affects everyone in this room. Understand the concerns they have with looming costs. Page 1, paragraph 5, Page 2, Paragraph 8. Mobile Dwelling Units, Additn'l Standards #12, Skirting, in a neat workmanship order, it condemns chips, and cracks (F2) Who will reimburse them? It puts an undue burden on owners who are providing housing. This would keep Target Logistics out. This is discrimination F(1) discrimination against trailer courts. Even the language, rather than mobile home parks. Stick home owners are not held to the same standards. This kind of discrimination is penalizing. I would hope you would listen to the concerns of these people.
8. Dianna Blend-I am a co-owner in Whispering Parks. The proposed ordinance will

- impact all owners for those who stay over 29 days. It will affect those with seasonal jobs and snowbirds. It will make owners to keep records. It unfairly holds us accountable. It made an advisory relationship with our customers. This will cause workers to vacate jobs. It invades the right to privacy and alternative housing on wheels. Lets help these people remain in our community. This would be a greater cost to Dawson County. Who will do the work of building it up. These are the people who come in and do the building. I suggest you set up a review committee to rewrite or make this a more workable document.
9. Vickie Smith-I live in Riverview. If it were not for Michael Blend, I wouldn't be able to own a home. Certain individuals come in and say I need to move my home. I make \$10/hour. Take in to consideration the home owners.
  10. Herb Sharbono-May father came here in 1909. For 75 years I've seen this community try to stop growth. Glendive doesn't want to grow. They want to keep the riff-raff out. Well, they're already here. The commissioners tried to stop it again. Miles City keeps growing. They have decent people sitting in your chairs.
  11. Marilyn Harkins-Haliburton moved out of Glendive and went to Baker. Dawson County wouldn't give them a tax break. Now Baker has the great indoor swimming pool that Haliburton built. Glendive doesn't.
  12. Pam Mitchell Ramirez-The comments about outsiders is ridiculous. I'm going to shoot you if you enter my property. This is ridiculous. It is not what the ordinance was meant for.
  13. Ed Jasmine-I can only afford something that is used. I couldn't do it. I would have to move out.
  14. Jane Staenke-am the manager of the RV park owned by Michael Blend. 29 days is not right. My husband and I use to be in the construction business. We moved to the jobs and live in our RV. This means we would have to move every 29 days. We often had to be at job sites 2 to 3 months.
  15. Can't make out name-I own a trailer house. I won't be able to live in my own home.
  16. Sherri Schoopman. The idea for regulations on man camps is a good idea. I don't know why you're dragging in established trailer courts. I know someone living there and she can't afford to fix it. Don't address mobile homes. There are 453 job openings with 126 people applying. They are going to the western part of the state. Don't attack our community. Those coming in should have the same rights as we do.
  17. Charles Powell-I live in Casistas Del Rio. Why are you discriminating against this class of people?
  18. Bob Laser-This falls under Agenda 21-separation of class of people.
  19. Michael Blend-I didn't come prepared with line by line edits. When I came in, a number of these parks had greatly deteriorated. I have made many repairs. There are more we would like to make. It takes time and money. I can't get the labor. I have to house them as well. There are many factors needed for long term and short term housing. Many people are arriving here with little funds. All vocations. All residents shop here. Many come here to build motels. They are here for 3 months. They still need housing options. RV's can be set up for year round housing. The needs vary by person. Most older homes don't have pitched roofs. We have disposed of unsafe ones. In some instances we have had people come needing homes and we were able to get them into a hail dented home. We have always made the recommended changes. In regards to the proposal. A change is needed to define a short period. Less than 29 days isn't right. Most people don't know how long they are going to be here. It may depend on a job, how long it takes, once they get here if they find a job. I appreciate your openness and input. Reference MCA 50-2-130. I don't think the county can trump State Code.
  20. Art Gehmert-We should be welcoming people, not sending them away. Section H, I have a single home on my property. I have to pay fees, have it inspected. We missed the boat in the 50's and the 80's. Our planning book is out of date. There are flood issues. I don't know if some here think they know better than we do. Look forward for the future, the water, sewers, and streets. If they stay here more than 30 days, then they're going to have to leave. I hope you tear it up and throw it away.
  21. Betty Mobe. I am new to Glendive. I have lived here since January 7<sup>th</sup>. I was looking for a place to retire and apartment rent was \$1600-\$2000/month. People

- are being displaced, rent is doubled and they are being forced out. I couldn't have lived anywhere, but I found a place at Casitas Del Rio. I can't fix the trailer myself. I would have to find someone to do this. I could be fined because I do not have number on the trailer.
22. Frances Peterson-I would second Mrs. Blend's motion for a committee that takes into consideration both sides of the table.
  23. Unknown-Question is there a misunderstanding about the 29 day rule?
  24. Penina Weaver-Everyone here has a problem. No one has offered a solution other than a committee. It is all negative. The way to get something done. The commission needs to offer assistance. They people here may need the money for clothing & food. Rather than you have to do this or else, say we'll offer services to help you. I would rather have a chip in my house than to have my daughter wear a coat to bed.
  25. Frank Crisafulli-60-70% of the mobile homes here will not meet the requirements. Where did this (ordinance) come from, California? There has only been a \$20 increase in lot rent. We have not doubled the rent, but we would have to. That would be a detriment to the community. They are struggling making payments the way it is.
  26. Rita Nelson-I live on a fixed income. I've helped my ex-husband remodel trailer homes in order to give homeless a place to live. He does a great job, but they wouldn't meet the standards. I think Glendive is comfortable. They are picking on mobile home owners. If we remove a hitch & wheels, we are no longer a mobile home. If you don't like it, don't enter.
  27. Arlene Geiser-I rent & own a mobile home. It is not a mobile home anymore. It is classified as it is on a foundation. The garage needs to be done. I can't afford to. What about the houses that look like hell. There are trailers that look like a pig sty. We can't get anything done with her. Does anyone say anything about that? If I have to move, I won't go back and live with my mother, so where am I going to go? I have M.S. I can't do things. I love the hitch on my trailer. If there is a flood, how am I going to move it?
  28. Alan Beeber-Section F item 5, "shall meet or exceed & shall continue to meet or exceed". This is a subjective term and ever changing. Older trailers will never meet those standards. My '78 trailer will never meet 2000 standards.
  29. Geiser-I was told previously not to skirt it, now you say you have to skirt it. Make up your minds. I have a friend who when he was told he couldn't skirt it. He moved to Sidney even though he pays \$500 for lot rent.
  30. Crisafulli- I hope you listen to what people have to say. I hope the 2 gentleman over here won't retaliate.
  31. Max-Where are all of these junk trailers going to be put, Are we going to have a junk yard for trailers? It costs \$5-7,000 for a gabled roof. No one could afford that. They will have to leave, if the trailer can't stay here.
  32. Unknown-There are unintended consequences. It will contribute to blight, as the people won't leave their trailers.
  33. Unknown-There are penalties and we would be guilty of a misdemeanor, that is not the American way.
  34. Ilene Stedman-There is a place for the ordinance, but the exterior appearance is not relevant.
  35. Alan Doane-Quotes the 4<sup>th</sup> Amendment to the Constitution. There are a lot of people feeling insecure. I like the fact that you are being pro-active, people have the freedom to choose where to live and how to live. You don't have the consent of the people. You have a lot of PR work to gain the consent of the people back.
  36. Carmen Beeber. I'm a single Mom. When I bought my trailer, there was a lot of stuff my trailer wouldn't pass. There is already a problem with housing in Glendive and this will make the problem worse.
  37. Robert Sarver-This has come up several times. Unless the commissioners have in their budget for subsidizing their housing. It cost \$10,000 to replace the roof & windows on my house. They have something to worry about.
  38. Unknown, Are these regulations legal? Have you taken into consideration what it will cost the people and county?
  39. Adam Gartner-Your interpretations are not correct. We will answer your questions. We are not out to oust anyone. Give us a little credit. We have addressed some of these issues. This is a draft document and we will be

addressing others.

40. Unkown-Will this be put to a vote of the people?
41. An ordinance is not voted on by the public.
42. Unknown-I don't believe this is ok.

**Petition to establish county road on Hillside Lane**- Commissioner Buxbaum stated that he and the road Supervisor had driven the road and it was currently not up to the county road standards and it appeared to be a private driveway. Travis Stroh, who presented the petition, stated that he had some additional information in regards to this road. He submitted a letter from 1984 from the previous owner whom he purchased the home from. The county maintained the road and there should be no problem in the future. It is a short road and there are other roads not far away. He had spoken to Ed Ereth from the MDT Planning Department and it shows the road on the tax map, so there is a fuel tax that you are receiving funding from to maintain this road. Ed Sherman stated that he had placed crushed rock on the road and maintained it himself for 26 years. We've paid our taxes. We can't get a clear title and therefore losing value to our land. This road has been a trail. It was maintained when Harold Skartved was commissioner. Other than that period of time, the owners have maintained it themselves. Keith Mitchell stated that a portion of

the road is blacktop, because he did it himself. We did it, because we needed it. We are not objecting to it. They need and deserve a good road. They were asked if they had an easement. Keith Mitchell stated that they do not have an easement, because that would not relieve him of any liability. The commissioners will further review the request.

Road Report

- Joe Sharbono reported that there was some trouble on the road where Wadsworth was hauling and he visited with them and they are willing to work with them and he will come down shortly and drive the road with him, so they can discuss the areas of concern.
- He also reported that he is still short a mechanic and 1 laborer.
- He noted that the Weed Department has joined in with a contract for spraying Buffalo Rapids Irrigation Ditches. This is a 4 year agreement.
- Joe Sharbono asked if the commissioners had received any requests for servicing roads. They stated the only area was in Highland Park and they are still waiting on direction from the County Attorney before they respond to the Subdivision requests. Joe also asked about 7 Mile Drive. They agreed all that they could do was to patch holes for now. Cold mix was not ready now, but they can fix the potholes. No we are not doing an overlay even though that rumor has been going around.
