A draft Resolution was presented, but Clerk & Recorder, Shirley Kreiman stated that this language was the same as the Resolution from 4 years ago, but thought it would be appropriate to add language to clarify it to the voters that if they vote in favor, it will be an increase of .6 from what they are currently paying. A motion was made to approve the resolution pending the language change and approval of language from the county attorney. Motion was seconded and voted in favor by all Commissioners.

Memorandum of Understanding with the City of Glendive Utility Connection and Wastewater Treatment Conditions-The commissioners stated that the City and the County have agreed to mutually work together toward a single Waste Water Treatment Plant. It has been determined and agreed upon that the most desired and cost effective alternative is for the city to construct a Wastewater Treatment Plant and the County to tie into such treatment plant. In order to apply for grants a memorandum with the City and the County is needed. This is memorandum of understanding that they will collectively work together, but a detailed contract will also be needed later with specific in depth details. A motion was made to accept the Memorandum of understanding with the City of Glendive. Motion was seconded and voted in favor by all Commissioners.

10) AMENDMENT
TO WIC CONTRACT

Amendment to Wic Contract 12-07-5-21-005-0 MT Dept of Public Health and Human Services and the Dawson County Health Department-Jeanne Seifert stated that this was an amendment dated in December, but we had, for whatever reason, only recently received it. It amends the contract language to state that the reporting needs to be in compliance with the federal transparency act. As a government agency we are already in compliance with this. She also noted that there is an interesting amendment concerning text messaging while driving and the contract language states that the contractor and subcontractors are requested to adopt and enforce policies in accordance with Presidential Executive order 14513, October 1, 2009 that ban text messaging by owners, officers, employees, agents, and subcontractors while driving vehicles for the purposes of the work contracted through this contract. The current Dawson County cell phone policy was briefly discussed as addressing this matter, but the specific wording in regards to “temporarily stationary due to traffic, a traffic light, stop sign” may not specifically be addressed in County policy. A motion was made to approve the contract amendment. Motion was seconded and voted in favor by all Commissioners.

- There was notice of an Ag workshop on March 12 in Great Falls with Jon Tester.
- Doug Keever sent a proposed West Glendive Sewer Lagoon Policy. As the county is currently not in compliance with discharge requirements and in the process to phase out the current system by 2014 and wished to support proposed economic growth but must balance it with outdated wastewater treatment, DEQ has verbally informed them that the state will consent to additional discharges or increased discharges, but they may incur fees, therefore the West Glendive Sewer Lagoon will require written agreements and submitted project plans with maps for any proposed developments to assume those associated costs. The county will review further before adopting and should be receiving written notice of the verbal information from DEQ.

Road Report

Joe Sharbono stated that there will be another Gravel Pit, the Cullinan Gravel Pit and it will be permitted through the county. He has been in discussion with the landowner about graveling the affected roads in the permitting agreement process. He also stated they are planning to have an equipment auction on March 24th at the Fairgrounds complex on March 24th at 9:30 a.m. and other county departments are welcome to add items.

Public Comment

- Joe Sharbono asked the commissioners about the specs on how the floor was poured at the old weed building. The commissioners stated that if Alderman signs their agreement to finish the project they will be accepting the floor as is.
- Joe Sharbono asked about the locations for Safe Routes to School as the road dept has been in the process of clearing tree debris in these areas. Jeanne Seifert stated that she has a map that she can give to Joe, but they have not heard any word on the matter recently.

Forest Park Homeowners-The commissioners opened the floor to homeowners who were present who asked to be on the agenda:

Tom Christensen-He read a statement requesting that the county commissioners retract any statements they have made regarding the homeowners association and was requesting that the commissioners make an advisory board consisting of 7 elected members from forest park homeowners and prepare a resolution to change how an advisory board is established.

Commissioner Buxbaum asked for a copy of his written statement.

Tom Christensen also stated that he had a written statement from Deb and Charlie Moore that requested postage for a mailing and they would volunteer time for mailing and would place a sign on their property for a meeting.

John Haase- Stated that he was in agreement with the statement from Tom and would to have a voted on advisory committee.

Kent White- Stated that he was in agreement with Tom and John.

Brad Aimonetti- Also stated he was in agreement with the previous speakers.

Dick Ulrich- He came forth with a letter that he said was delivered to specific homeowners about this meeting that included statements that were inaccurate in regards to comments that realtors are telling potential buyers there are problems with Forest Park and the Homeowners Association. He went and talked to all 3 realtors and felt the letter was inaccurate. The realtors all say they take all potential buyers to Forest Park as good location for families. He wants to do this right and this is garbage.

Roberta Christensen- She was told by a realtor that Forest Park was in a homeowners association.

Tracey Rod- Stated that she lives in Forest Park and previously worked for a title company and if the home is located within a Homeowners Association that it would have to be disclosed to you when you bought the property.

Carleen Lordemann- I've gone to all the meetings the Association has had and very few people ever attend. The board had good intentions. Maybe they didn't go about it correctly. It has been very slow, but they haven't been given a chance. We are not going to please everyone. Taxes will have to go up and everybody is up in arms about that. In order to live in a good community something will need to be done. There is no zoning, therefore no control. People have been nasty to them. They had good intentions.

Peggy Haase- I have never been nasty to them before. We are not a homeowners association. We do have zoning, but it has to be enforced by the commissioners. But having an association took the burden off of the

commissioners. I have elected them and I can talk to my elected officials when I want to.

Denise Dion – I want someone to say what an advisory board does. What is a homeowners association. The homeowners assn. had a treasurer. Tom Wynne was the treasurer. An advisory board has no control. An advisory board isn't registered. The Association has the ballots from an election. They have a 5 member board. It was difficult to get 5 members and now you want 7 members. You need to really think about this. You need to weigh the pros and cons. The association is one that got the snow removed last year. If you're upset now, you wait.

Kent White-We're not part of the Assn. We're not trying to take away what has been. I don't agree for paying for an attorney, when I have three commissioners that I should be able to go to.

Jim Lauckner – I'm confused. In referring to a Homeowners Assn. I'm against a Homeowners Assn and in favor of an advisory board who is under the control of the commissioners.

Jennifer Adkins-I equally confused and my comment is, my understanding is a Homeowners Assn can be positive. It is a way to get things done as a community. If we create it, we as members vote on by-laws. How much can we vote on or how much authority it has, I am unsure of.

Gene Hanson-I served as President of the Homeowners Assn for 9 years. I now some of you disagree. I've been told I wasn't telling the truth. The pavement, lights, and water all happened through the HOA. Maybe there is a board that is a better way. We all got along when we ran a SID. There were no fees, or dues. We ran 3 SID's through there and it worked. We did it through the county commissioners and Helena and the County Attorney and it worked.

Myna Kintz-I'm not in a position as to be able to know which I would prefer. I think you need to start at the beginning. We're floundering. We don't understand the definition of an Advisory Board and a Homeowners Association or the difference of each.

Marty Gooddale-I would like more information. It needs to be voted in, so we are all represented. Issues in FP need to be addressed, like junk vehicles aren't being addressed. Find out which will better serve us. We need more information to make a decision.

Gary Lundman-I think all the anxiety comes from the words Home Owners Association. I appreciate what the previous board did. We were invited to attend meetings and most of us did not attend. If there was a 7 member board, I the past board members should be invited to be a part of it.

James Skillestad-We will go through the comments in regards to duties of the advisory board. We plan to publish the comments or conclusions in the paper.

Contract Amendment-Jeanne Seifert stated that the health department has received a new grant for Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting Infrastructure Development. They will have a 6 month time line to complete a survey for needs assessments. There is a strategic plan and process in place. It will help develop needs of access to health care including schools. She has felt that something like this was in order before, but they've never had the funding. This grant will enable them to do it. A motion was made to approve the amendment to Task Order 12-07-5-31-025-0 for July 1, 2005 – June 30, 2012 MIECHV ID project. Motion was seconded and voted in favor by all Commissioners.

Other Business:

Jeanne Seifert stated that had spoken to the Republican Central Committee concerning the Title X program at the health department and she wanted to clarify any questions that any one may have concerning this program. The questions stemmed from the Resolution that was signed March 17, 2011 supporting Health Funding. She felt there was a misconception about the Title X program. They are 1 of 7 county clinics that receive Title X funding. They see patients of 10% male and 90% female. They provide confidential testing and health care that can include contraceptives. They clients are charged on a sliding scale. The priority is given to low income who receive care at no cost up to a full cost charge, that is determined by a formula. The health department does not do abortions nor do they make any referrals for abortions. The grant prohibits in any way providing

abortion services. They are required to provide services to adolescents. The clients are required to fill out a questionnaire that asks if they are pregnant and if they request counseling. She feels the program provides affordable healthcare to residents who may not otherwise have access to it.

Road Report- Joe Sharbono stated that he would like to follow up with the commissioners on previous salary discussions he has had with them. He stated that he is proposing a \$3.00/hr raise straight across the board for this department. He feels that he can fund it currently out of his capital outlay budget. It would require \$23,000 to finish out the fiscal year. It would require \$90,000 a year forward. There are specifically 3 line items he could move budget from. We would lose equipment and road building power. Currently we have 200 miles of road in the Lindsay area and no operator to run the blade. It is becoming a safety issue, but he cannot hire employees at this rate of pay. There are local competitors for this skill set who are paying \$18.00-22.00/hr within the Glendive area and that doesn't even match what the oil field is paying. I have no qualified applicants. A couple with the longest employment time in a job at 3 months or no equipment experience at all. He is not trying to start a rift with other supervisors. This is the only solution I can come up with and I am asking permission to do this. The commissioners asked how he came up with a \$3.00/hr figure as this is a 20% increase and if we would still be able to retain employees. Joe stated that he felt the \$3.00 would put him in a competitive bracket, but there is no guarantee that we can retain employees. The clerk and recorded stated that employees are the most valuable county resource and this is a concern, but asked about the sustainability of such a raise as you cannot go back if this decision were made and how would they be able to fund any equipment replacement or road materials if it were all moved to wages. The county is at the max at what they can levy for the road and for the county, so what would get cut or how will we know until the next taxable valuation if there is any increase in mills? Joe stated that he would promote a voted mill levy for road materials (gravel/scoria). Currently he has some sources to get gravel. He was asked if he could expand where he placed applications at?
